The church is celebrating its **167**th Birthday on November 17. Here is a little information about the church. The state of Wisconsin was admitted to the union as the 30th state in 1848. The City of Oconto was incorporated in 1869. 166 years ago, on November 15, 1858, a group of like-minded Christians gathered at the home of Mrs. SA Turner establishing and organizing this Presbyterian congregation. The first house of worship was in 1863. The first house of worship was erected on the corner of main and State Streets. First Church Dedication 1865-1874; dedicated early in the summer of 1865. In January of 1874, the first church was destroyed by fire. The second church dedication was in 1874, on the same lot, a brick veneer building was erected. This church was dedicated on November 19, 1876. Fire destroyed this second church in December 22 of 1890. Third Church Erected and Dedicated a third church an impressive Romanesque-styled edifice of brick and stone was erected, dedicated on the first anniversary of the fire, December 22, 1891. The Romanesque-styled church was used until 1961 when the present church was built. And worship continues here.

Recipe Corner

We are going to be starting up the recipe corner again and Stacy would like anyone that has a favorite family recipe to please send it her way. This recipe is one of Polly's favorite fudge recipes.

Chocolate Cherry Fudge

- 1 14 oz can sweetened condensed milk
- 1 12 oz pkg semi-sweet chocolate chips
- 1/2 C. coarsely chopped almonds
- 1/2 C. candied cherries
- 1/ C. almond extract

Microwave milk, on high power for 1-1/2 min., until melted and smooth when stirred. Stir in almonds, cherries and extract. Blen then spread into a greased 9x9 pan. Chill until firm. Cut into squares, and store in airtight container and refrigerate.
